



MAKE YOUR OWN ANZAC POPPY

On Anzac Day we remember those who have fought for our country and served in our military services. Unfortunately, due to the corona virus, we will not be able to meet in groups as we normally would on Anzac Day. To ensure we still commemorate our ANZACS, it would be fantastic if we could all make our own poppies to place on our front doors or front fences as a symbol of our respect and thanks, and to show them that their contribution still matters to Australians, despite us not being able to gather together.

How to make your own poppy:

What you need:

White or Red paper/thin cardboard

Black paper/thin cardboard

Scissors

Glue

If you are using white paper you will need pens, markers, paint or crayons in red and black.

Instructions:

Print out two of our poppy templates and cut them out. For white paper you can use the template and colour it in with red pens/paint/crayon etc.

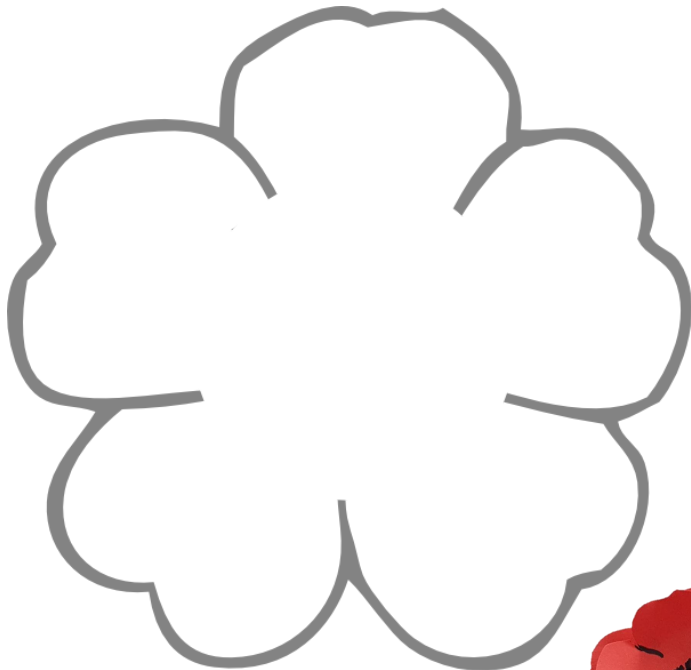
If you have red paper/cardboard you will need to trace the template onto it and then cut them out.

Once you have coloured the poppies you place the smaller one on top of the larger one and glue them together in the centre.

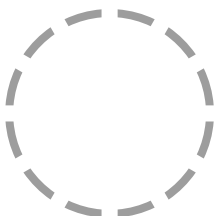
Cut a small circle out of white paper (you can colour it black) or use black paper and glue it onto the centre of the poppy.

Place your poppy or poppies onto your front door or front fence on Anzac Day - 25th April 2020.

TIP:

When you have assembled your poppy you can use a black marker pen to create the lines between the petals and add texture to the black centre.
